What is Grace Cares?

This year, Grace Ministries launched a new outreach initiative called Grace Cares.

Grace Cares unites several ministry efforts under one Christ-centered vision, serving those in our community facing homelessness, food insecurity, mobility challenges through our ramp ministry, and meeting urgent needs as they arise. At its heart, Grace Cares exists to live out the words of Jesus in Gospel of Matthew 25:40: “And the King will answer them, ‘Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.’”

In March, our primary focus is homeless children in Franklin County, where more than 180 students have been identified as experiencing homelessness and food instability.

During the extended spring break in April, when school meals are unavailable, Grace Cares has been asked to provide food for these children. We believe this is more than meeting a temporary physical need. It is an opportunity to reflect the compassion of Christ in tangible ways. As Scripture reminds us in 1 John 3:18, “Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth.”

We invite you to stand with us in prayer, through offerings, and in service. As partners and supporters, your generosity and prayers allow Grace Cares to respond compassionately and swiftly where needs are greatest.

Together, we can be the hands and feet of Christ in Franklin County, bringing hope where it is needed most.
