ANNUAL "TOP GUN" EVENT By scott yates

A gathering with prayer, fellowship and grilled food under a giant live oak tree at the Rose Hill Plantation in Nashville, N.C. celebrated the second annual "Top Gun" Christian Outdoor Enthusiasts sporting clay fundraising event for Grace Ministries.

The event in June has become a tradition for the ministry at the historic country estate with an 18th century manor house. The sporting clay range has been featured on ESPN Outdoors and is home of the Rose Hill Sporting Clay Challenge, one of the country's most elite clay tournaments.

Sporting clay participants and their family and friends gathered for the friendly competition and shared lunch prepared on the grounds. The shooting event consisted of 8 shooting stations and a pleasant walk through the woods filled with cheerful fellowship. Teams of 4 were formed and the scores were tallied individually to share among the participants.

During lunch, Grace Ministries Teaching Pastor Bert Woodburn interviewed Chris Arendt, a former NFL player with the Dallas Cowboys and Denver Broncos after a college football career at Duke University. Chris, who serves on the Grace Ministries Board of Directors, shared perspective on the lifestyle and challenges of NFL players and how the experience shaped his spiritual journey.

Insights includes the pressure players were under to take performance enhancing drugs, and Chris' refusal to tread down that path. Another fascinating perspective was the risk of injury at such as high level of competition with so many players trying to take a coveted position on the starting roster.

More than 13 corporate sponsors helped make the event possible and supported the ongoing work for Grace Ministries. Many sponsors also donated door prizes shared with participants.

Grace Ministries believes sharing God's love is the cornerstone to building relationships and is the key in bringing the Gospel to the lost and empowering believers with the boldness to share the Gospel. Many people shared testimony about how Grace Ministries is shaping their hearts and helping them to reach out to others with God's Word and love. Events like this one are just one example of how Grace Ministries is reaching the lost.

A TRIP TO THE HOLY LAND BY BOB GALLAGHER

On January 17, 2017 I joined Bert Woodburn and Reverend Ken Steigler for a trip to the Holy Land of Israel for 8 days with 23 additional passengers. We referred to ourselves as Pilgrims on a Pilgrimage to "Walk where Jesus walked and will walk again."

The "Pilgrims" spent time visiting the major sites of Israel such as the Western Wall, the Via Dolorosa, the city of Jericho, The Garden Tomb and much more. We also had our fair share of indulgences: breakfasts, lunches and dinners with plenty of good Mediterranean cuisine and learned about camel rides in the desert.

The main focus of the Holy Land trip was to create an intimate memory through the experience and knowledge that our Lord Jesus Christ once walked these lands as well as kings and prophets. The Bible comes alive having been in the lands where all this happened. For example, when we visit the hometown of a close friend for the first time, we connect the stories we heard about people and places where the stories took place. We literally "step into their story." Now, imagine having the same experience with the Gospel stories and the life of Our Lord! Visiting the Holy Land allows us to connect the stories we have heard about Jesus with the sites we see. Those stories 'enter' us in a way that change our hearts. Ask anyone who has been!

Why do we go to the Holy Land?

The Holy Land is an experience of the people we support. Who among our pilgrims will ever forget the visit to the Church of the Nativity to kneel, see and touch the place of Jesus's birth or the Church of the Holy Sepulcher and place your hands the "Stone of Annunciation" where Jesus's body was taken from the cross and prepared for the tomb.

By traveling to the Holy Land, we meet the Jewish people we support, and we see and hear how our support changes lives for the better. The Holy Land is an experience of the community and fellowship of Christian brothers and sisters and the opportunity to make new friends.

A lifelong memory for every member of this journey was sharing in a service with Holy communion at the Garden Tomb. Our journey to the Land of Our Lord, marking us as a Pilgrim, forever changed our hearts and drew us closer to Christ. We cherish our connection with the people of this land and our deepened connection with each other.

Mount of Beatitudes, The Primacy of Peter, Tabgha, Capernaum, Wadi Hammam, Migdal, Cliffs of Arbel, Baptism in the Jordan River, Sepho-ris, Nazareth Cana, Ein Harod Gideon Springs, Bet Shean, Megiddo, Caesarea, Jerusalem, Ein Gedi, Kalia Swim in the Dead Sea, Jericho, Qumran, Masada, Mt of Olives, Dominus Flevit, Gethsemane, Southern Wall, Herodium, Church of the Nativity, Bethlehem, Shepherds Field, Temple Mount, St. Anne's, Ecce Homo, Via Dolorosa, Church of the Holy Sepulcher, Cardo, Mt Zion, Gallicantu, Old City of Jerusalem, Upper Room and the Garden Tomb.

At the end of our pilgrimage we walked away with a treasure of memories that will remain with us forever to share with others and the possibility that we will return one day to see and learn more.

EMMANUEL ORPHANAGE MISSION TRIP (CONTINUED)

Casa Hogar Emmanuel Orphanage is home to more than fifteen children ranging in ages of three to sixteen. Many of the children do not know where their parents are. In some instances human smugglers, called "Coyotes", who employ Mexican immigrants for labor in the United States, illegally transported the parents across border promising them to help their children to go with them later, but never do. Some of the children's parents have disappeared while crossing the border. Other children are there, because their parents are unable to financially care for them.

When we arrived at the orphanage we were greeted by smiling faces and open arms. Immediately, the fun started by playing soccer in the dirt field in front of the orphanage building. The children were excited because they had just received a brand new ball from the mission team that had served the week before us.

We started each day early with devotion, prayer and a planning breakfast meeting. Though we were divided into teams we all pitched in whenever there was something to be done. I worked with Bob, Jacob and Bert on the construction of a new orphanage building. We built a wall, a window frame and the placement of a new front door. We also trimmed weeds that were around the basketball court and took out thorn bushes around the baseball field.

Our teaching team, Heather, Becky, Carol and Kerry held VBS for the children. They taught the children about our Lord through Bible stories, songs, crafts and activities. I was amazed how they were able to teach in Spanish and help the children with their English. When VBS was over everyone spent time praying, talking and playing with the children. We were always actively engaging with the children and the staff.

Later in the week we took the children to Agua Prieta , a city 35 miles east of Naco. There we took the children to the movies to see Cars 3. Afterwards we all went to dinner at a restaurant called La Cabana. The children loved it. This was something that they rarely ever get to do. It was great to share in their excitement.

In addition, to serving at the orphanage we did food distribution. We shopped at a local store in Naco and purchased sacks of flour, rice, and beans, along with canned tomatoes and candy. All of us spent a day making bags that contained the above ingredients to give to families in the town of Naco. We went from home to home distributing these bags of food and sharing the love of Christ.

Close to the end of our week we had a cookout for the children and grilled hot dogs and hamburgers. We surprised them with a piñata full of candy. Later in the evening we took them to a carnival that was held in the town. We bought the children ice cream, enjoyed a concert and had a great time dancing. The next morning we had to pack up and head back home. Tears were shed, hugs exchanged and the children begged us to come back soon.

Our trip back home was long for we all missed the children. It was a blessing to be able to share the love of Christ with children and staff of the orphanage, as well as with the entire community of Naco. Our team bonded through our trip and made plenty of memories.

Thanks to the support of Grace Ministries, and all those that donated money for this mission. We were able share Christ with others but also provide, food, clothing, shoes and toys to the children of the orphanage and the people of Naco.

Grace Ministries USA is already planning the mission trip for next year. I hope you will consider joining us for it and be the vessel that God uses to change someone's life.
