MEMORIES MADE AT NACO, SONORA

Grace Ministries USA sent nine missionaries on a week-long mission trip to Naco, Sonora, Mexico from July 28 to August 4, 2018. The purpose of the trip was to care for the children of Casa Hogar Emmanuel Orphanage and the people in the community of Naco. Our team was led by Bert Woodburn and Bob Gallagher of Grace Ministries. Members of the team included Leon Harris, John Jones and Deborah Ellison of Friendship Baptist Church; Mike Matthews of Pilot Baptist Church; Marty Simpkins of the Bridge Church; and Cindy Woodburn and Jacob Woodburn of Grace Ministries USA.

This year, we brought the children soccer uniforms donated by Franklinton High School. Each child received a jersey and shorts sporting the Red Ram's colors. Jeremy Crawford of Franklinton High School partnered with Bert Woodburn to make the uniforms availa-

ble. The children also received clothes, coloring books, hats, various toys and soccer equipment that were donated by friends and families of the missionaries.

The mission team was busy with various duties but our main priority was to love and care for the children. The first thing we did when we arrived was to treat all the children for head lice, which had plagued the orphanage throughout the summer. We held a week-long vacation Bible school for the children, during which we taught them Bible stories and shared the Gospel, while also intertwining games and engaging them in arts and crafts. "The most touching moment for me was when Pastor Harris shared the Gospel with the children. Not only did we have a number of children accept the Lord but we had three that want to be baptized," remarked Cindy Woodburn.

PRAYER WALK

On Saturday, April 14, 2018 the Wake Forest Prayer Walk was held. Over 200 people, from various Wake Forest churches and institutions, came together to pray for town leaders and public servants. Teams were formed and named for the four Biblical gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Each team started in a different direction then converged at Centennial Plaza at the Wake Forest Town Hall. This year's prayer walk was organized by Bob Gallagher, president of Grace Ministries USA, Reverend Ken Steigler of All Nations Church and founder of the Christian Clergy, Chaplains & Missionaries (3CM) interdenominational organization and Bert Woodburn, teaching pastor of Grace Ministries USA, in conjunction with the 3CM Organization.

Bert Woodburn stated, "praying for our leaders is a biblical command that we are to obey and it says in 1 Timothy 2:1-2 (KJV) "I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty." It is important that the town's leaders, the commissioners, as well as town staff, police officers, firefighters and other public servants know that the local faith-based community is thankful for their service and pray for their well-being. In addition, "we pray for all the people in our community and its needs, ... it's just to pray that God will continue with good things in the community – good government and government transparency," commented Rev. Ken Steigler.

For Tilda Caudle, associate minister at Olive Branch Missionary Baptist Church and the president of the Northeast Community Coalition, the walk is a personal, spiritual movement, in addition to the physical component. "We do believe God's hand is in it and we do believe he has ordained it. We want our town representatives to know that we care and God cares for them," she said. "The organizers all feel the same way. We want to be in one accord. We're excited about it, because we believe God will answer our prayers if we lift up the people working for the town. We believe God will hear us."

GRACE MINISTRIES HOSTS WORLD RENOWNED ISRAEL SPEAKERS

Grace Ministries and the Christian Clergy, Chaplains and Missionaries group (3CM) hosted two world-renowned speakers, Sondra Oster Baras and Les Lawrence, for a community meeting and discussion about the importance of praying and supporting Biblical Israel.

Sondra, the director of Christian Friends of Israeli Communities (CFOIC) presented, "Truth about Jewish History and Heritage in Israel." She spoke about the shared scripture of our faiths and the need for Christians to support Israel. She described life in Judea and Samaria, her praise for the rebirth of Israel and the settlement movement in the communities of Judea and Samaria. CFOIC Heartland is the only Christian organization to focus exclusively on the communities in the heartland of Biblical Israel.

By reviewing and commenting on current events in the Middle East, Les Lawrence took us through a presentation about how God is restoring Israel. He is the author and voice for "Christian Zionists" and founder of Elisha Vision Ministry and the Issachar Forum: A Prophetic Think Tank in Wake Forest NC. Les was pastor at Maranatha Chapel/Flowing River Church, in Clearwater, Florida for 24 years before moving to North Carolina in 1997 and serving as Director of Raleigh Christian Community School of Ministry for three years. He then led Harvest Celebration Church in Wake Forest for five years followed by a similar role with Shalom Peniel Ministries. He now travels and speaks full-time as an author and voice for Christian Zionists.

These fascinating presentations and discussions taught those in attendance why we are called to support Israel, including:

God says he will bless those who bless Israel. "I will bless them that bless thee and curse them that curse thee, and in thee shall all the nations of the earth be blessed" Genesis 12:3. "For the nation that will not serve you (Israel) will perish; it will be utterly ruined" Isaiah 60:12.

We owe a debt for the blessings we have received through Israel. Through Israel the promises and covenants were given. Through Israel came the law, the prophets, and the Messiah who has opened up access to God for all, and through the Jewish apostles the gospel first went to the nations. (Romans 9:4-5 and Romans 15:27)

God's blessings on Israel have not been revoked. "but as regards the election they are beloved for the sake of their forefathers. For the gifts and call of God are irrevocable" Romans 11:28.

One evening we took the children to the neighboring town of Agua Preita to see the movie “Incredibles 2”, went to dinner, and to a carnival where we all got ice cream. On our last night we held a party for the children and had a piñata full of candy. The most heartfelt moments for me were the evenings we spent time with the children dancing, singing and playing games.

There was work to be done as well. We painted the orphanage's basketball court using the colors red, white and green to resemble the Mexican flag. Repairs were made to leaky pipes in the kitchen and tires bordering the playground were painted.

An important part of our trip is to care for the families living in the town of Naco. The mission team purchased and distributed over 100 food bags throughout the town. The food bags contained rice, beans, flour, canned tomatoes, candy and Bible tracks in Spanish.

Most of the families living in Naco live in one-room shacks, where it is not uncommon for a family of five or more to share, that small space. “It was a blessing to serve the people of Naco and it was amazing how some families turned down the food so it could be given to others that had less than them,” stated John Jones.

It was a week full of fun, fellowship, work and spiritual enlightenment. “I loved our week in Naco,” commented Bob Gallagher. “The relationships we made are precious. More than anything, the team was amazing, and the memories are priceless. I'm so thankful to God for blessing me with the opportunity and I know that not a moment, or a dollar spent was wasted.”

ANNUAL SPORTING CLAY EVENT

“Fighting fires can be life threatening...”

Grace Ministries USA Annual Sporting Clay Classic was held on Saturday, June 2, 2018 at Rose Hill Plantation in Nashville, N.C. The event was a great success again this year and was filled with fun competition, fellowship and prayer. Our Sporting Clay classic has become a tradition for the ministry and we are blessed that we are able to hold it at one the country's most elite clay tournament venues.

Sporting clay participants and their families and friends gathered for the friendly competition and shared lunch prepared on the grounds. A fun part of the event is the silent auction and the door prize drawings, where everyone is a winner. The highlight was hearing Mitch Pullen's testimony of faith.

Mitch Pullen is one of Grace Ministry's original Board of Directors members. He is a retired Ranger from Nash County, N.C. before that he was Assistant County Ranger in Brunswick County and District 8 Strike Team Leader. As a member of the District 8 Strict Team he and his team were sent to assist in fighting fires throughout the United States. Mitch shared an experience he had fighting a fire in Yellowstone National Park where he was part of a team that was sent into the wilderness to help contain a fire.

The fire in Yellowstone Park was a life changing experience for Mitch. He and his team were assigned a leader from the area, who happened to be a Native American Indian, experienced in fighting fires within the park. Mitch stated, "The dangers of fighting wildfires can be life threatening, especially when things go wrong. In addition, there is the treat of wild animals like grizzly bears, wolves and mountain lions seeking safety from the fire". The fire was dangerous, and as the team worked to build buffers, they noticed the fire was coming closer to them; during the night the fire started surrounding them. Mitch said it was like "Satan's flaming arrows coming at you and it gives you a new perspective on fighting fires in the wilderness". He said he knew things were bad when their leader told them he was concerned that the entire team was not going to make it, unless they could be rescued and airlifted to safety. "Thankfully, we were all airlifted out with not much time to spare," commented Mitch. He that shared during this time his faith in the Lord and in prayer strengthened him. Mitch said he has learned that in bad and good times we have to remember that through our Lord we have "the helmet of salvation, shield of faith and sword of the spirit which always provides us with defense and protection."

The Christian Clergy, Chaplains and Missionaries (3CM), an interdenominational Christian group founded by Reverend Ken Steigler, is now part of Grace Ministries USA. Steigler made the request to the Grace Ministries Board of Directors. The Grace Ministries board agreed that the mission statements of both groups are aligned and supportive of a ministry to glorify God.

He is called by many "Rev. Ken" and is a retired pastor who works as a minister at Wake Forest United Methodist Church and All Nations Church in North Raleigh. As a young seminary student at the Boston University of Theology, he led a team that traveled to Selma in 1965 to work with Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and other civil rights leaders.

He founded 3CM as an interdenominational ministry for clergy and church leaders in the region to collaborate and share prayer, and was part of implementing the Wake Forest Prayer Walk. In addition, Rev. Ken, along with Pastor Enoch Holloway of Friendship Chapel Church founded "It's Time," a ministry promoting harmony among all races in Wake Forest.

The vision of 3CM is to actualize John 17:17-23 in the Wake Forest community, state of North Carolina, United States of America and the nations of the

world in intercessory prayer. This is done by full filling Ephesians 6:10-18 in teaching prayer ministry nationally and internationally to all clergy, chaplains and missionaries. Together, the members pray for national and international leadership; children and families; the developing world; the unreached; the persecuted; the prison population; the nursing home residents and service workers; the homeless and poor; the Muslim world and peace in Jerusalem.

3CM collaborates and connects with Intercessors for America; National Concerts of Prayer; John 17:21 International; International House of Prayer; Far East Broadcasting Company; Upper Room; Way Makers and other national and international prayer ministries.

Members of the ministry meet monthly and focus on prayer, discipleship and building trust among the Christian community. 3CM and Rev. Ken will continue to lead an annual Dr. Martin Luther King trip to Selma, Atlanta, Montgomery and Birmingham. Grace Ministries president Bob Gallagher is taking an active leadership role in 3CM and will be leading a trip to Israel in 2020. Grace Ministries will run next year's Prayer Walk and consider expanding the scope to nearby towns and other locations throughout North Carolina.

VICTOR'S STORY

On Tuesday, January 30, 2018 Victor Gonzales was working for Triangle Grading & Paving as a pipe layer and was responsible for laying piping for utilities, storm drains, water lines and sewers. He was fixing a pipe in a ditch when all of a sudden, tragedy struck. "It started off as just a regular Tuesday morning for me," Victor said. "I was working at Ocean Isle Beach. My boss thought I got out of the ditch, but I was still there fixing everything. He drove the truck back with a pipe and I got pinned against a storm drain pipe. All the pressure was on my stomach and went straight into my left leg. I just fell to the ground, because my vertebrae broke."

Victor was airlifted by helicopter to a hospital in Myrtle Beach, S.C. He underwent over five surgeries during the next week. After all the operations were done, Gonzales' small intestine was removed, part of his large intestines and one kidney. In addition, a bar with pins was put in his back, he had internal bleeding, damage to his pancreas and damaged liver. Due to a blood clot in his

left leg he had to have it amputated to avoid the spread of infection. Victor was in a medical induced coma for five days and didn't know his own situation until weeks later. He would spend the next couple months in intensive care. His family was with him around the clock. Months later he was transported to the Shepherd Center in Atlanta, Georgia where he received rehabilitation. Then he was sent to Duke Hospital to handle an infection and then, finally, home.

"It felt so good to be home and I know my family was so relieved". Due to the loss of his small intestines he is unable to eat. "One of the hardest things for me has been that I am unable to eat. I have not had any food to eat since the day of my injury, which was January 30. Since then I receive liquid nutrients through an IV. I can eat popsicles and a few sips of water and/or crushed ice", stated Victor. He is still in a wheel chair waiting for his leg to completely heal so he can receive a prosthetic leg. "Every morning I thank God I'm here," Victor said.

“My mom helps me every day. I sit in the living room and do my exercises. I go to physical therapy once a week. I try to walk around the house with the use of a walker. I’m just enjoying life and getting use to my new “normal.”

Bert Woodburn, the teaching Pastor for Grace Ministry’s is also the head men’s soccer coach for Franklinton High school. He coached Victor when he played for Franklinton’s soccer team from 2012-15, where he was as a left defensive back and left winger. In addition, he was his youth pastor at Red Oak Baptist Church.

On Monday, September, 2018 Victor was back on Franklinton’s soccer field for the first time since he graduated. He was honored as an assistant coach on the sidelines, giving advice and feedback to the players on the bench. At halftime, Victor shared his story and gave his testimony of faith. “It’s a big deal for Victor being here tonight. I just praise God for him and what he’s done,” said Bert. “Our second half performance that led to the team’s victory tonight was inspired by the players drive to win for Victor. The players were pretty motivated by him,” commented Bert. The team honored Victor with his original soccer jersey from his freshman year and a team hat.

Within the next few months Victor said he hopes receive his prosthetic leg. By the end of the year he hopes to be on the Duke transplant list for a new small intestine and possibly a new liver. The transplant surgery will keep him in the hospital for a few months to recover and he will have to take anti-rejection medications the rest of his life. Bert said, “I am touched to see a young man that I have ministered to and coached continue fighting the good fight. Having Victor alive and well is answered prayer and a blessing. His attitude is what blows my mind. He lost a leg and some organs, and he’s on intravenous feeding and he’s just nothing but positive. If that doesn’t motivate you for life, I don’t know what does. He’s an amazing man. He’s just trying to make a difference. Victor told me that God has planned something big for him.”

During his months of recovery, Victor has given God all the glory for where he is now. He was told he might not live. Now he’s living life to the fullest. “God is always there,” he said. “God doesn’t want you to give up and He answers your prayers. The little things count. Prayer definitely works.
